Birdlebough Class of 1973 marks milestone reunion with generosity, scholarship funds

Although many members of the John C. Birdlebough High School Class of 1973 had not stepped foot inside the high school since graduating, their fond memories prompted them to do something remarkable to celebrate their 50th class reunion.

Led by Wes Pickreign (class of 1973) and members of a reunion committee, the class recently celebrated their big milestone by giving back to their alma mater in an even bigger way. The committee had several priorities, which included paying for a new lighted frame for Mr. Birdlebough's portrait, covering the costs of the caps and gowns for this year's graduates, and establishing an activities fund — \$5,000 for 20 years — that would aid clubs and individual students.

"The activities fund would hopefully reach students that a scholarship fund might not," Pickreign said. "This fund could be used for guest speakers, entry fees for clubs, or help with fees such as the fee for SAT exams to name a few."

As members of the reunion class began to donate to those efforts, another classmate offered to establish a scholarship in the name of the class of 1973. That scholarship will be maintained for 20 years and awarded to two students annually in the amount of \$10,000 each.

"My classmates responded generously and enthusiastically to our request for donations," Pickreign said. "School was such a positive experience for so many of us. Personally, I had a number of teachers, coaches, and the HS principal, Mr. Castiglione, who went the extra mile for me.

Prestigious Hurd scholarships presented to JCB seniors

As members of the John C. Birdlebough High School class of 2023 celebrated their commencement June 22, the day proved to be a bit more special for graduating seniors Alan Jacques, Allenmichael Borasky and Elisabeth Caltabiano.

For the trio, the ceremony was highlighted by a major presentation: the Robert and Roberta Hurd Scholarship. Now in its ninth year, the scholarship provides one \$40,000 scholarship, one \$15,000 scholarship and one \$10,000 scholarship to graduating Phoenix students who embody the traits that the Hurds valued. This year's recipients, Jacques (\$10,000), Borasky (\$15,000) and Caltabiano (\$40,000), met the academic and character requirements that the Hurds envisioned for the award-winners.

The recipients must have demonstrated high moral values, shown excitement about going to college, had financial need and scored in the top 15 percent of their class.

The Hurd scholarship is courtesy
of a nearly \$1 million bequest
gift left by the couple after they
passed away. The longtime
Phoenix residents and alumni of
PCSD schools valued education
and earmarked funds to be
allocated to Phoenix students via these annual
scholarships.

"This gift will have an immeasurable positive impact on the lives of many children who might


